### **Attendance**

We have high expectations for children's attendance and punctuality and we ensure that these expectations are communicated to families.

Every Day Counts....

Attendance Matters

Children are expected to attend school punctually every day and they are required to be at school, for the full day. The morning register will close at 9.05am. Pupils will receive an unauthorised absence mark (U) if they do not attend school before this time.

We understand children sometimes can be poorly and they can't come in to school. However, if they have a cough or cold and feel well enough in themselves they still should come to school and we will contact you if we need too.

If your child is too unwell to come to school you must contact the school office before 8.45am on the first day and every subsequence day of their child's absence – it is a legal requirement that you provide an explanation for the reason for absence and an estimation of how long the absence will last, e.g. one school day.

We are currently updating the attendance policy and we will be sharing this with you all, once it has been approved. We expect all of our children to have at least 96% attendance throughout the school year.




