

#### **Sports Premium Report**

Ashbrook Infant and Nursery School appreciates the contribution of PE to the health and well-being of its children. We also acknowledge that a broad, balanced, high quality curriculum and extra-curricular activities have a positive impact on concentration, confidence attitude and achievement.

We are committed to ensuring that all pupils receive a minimum of two hours of PE per week, delivered by well-trained and enthusiastic teachers. The Sport Premium funding is allowing us to develop a sustainable improvement in teacher confidence and a new curriculum based on developing children's physical literacy skills. Regular staff training opportunities are provided for teachers and teaching assistants (TAs) to keep them updated with new ideas and changes in the PE curriculum.

We run a Sports Week every year for Foundation Stage and Key Stage One, and an annual sports day which is often a joint event with Ashbrook Junior School. Highly qualified coaches provide a range of after school sports clubs throughout the year, both for team and individual sports. We subscribe to the Platinum package from the Erewash School Sports Partnership, which provides professional development, curriculum support and a range of competitive activities. We have used Premier Sports too this year to ensure that we have a range of different opportunities for the children and staff to learn and develop from.

#### What is the Sports Premium?

The government has provided funding of £150 million per annum for the academic years 2013/2014 and 2014/2015 to provide new and substantial primary school sport funding. the funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to Primary Schools to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. Each school will receive £8000 plus an extra £5 per pupil for the academic year 201/2017. Here at Ashbrook Infants that means around £8800. The money can **only** be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

### **Monitoring and Evaluation**

- This report will be updated at the end of each academic year to identify the success of the above initiatives and the impact they have had.
- Delivery will be monitored by the PE leader in the first instance. This will be overseen and managed at senior level by the Headteacher and Deputy Head.
- Monitor the take up of extra-curricular activities.
- Monitoring will include observations of teaching, drop-ins to clubs run by coaching staff to ensure that provision is of a high quality.
- Parent and pupil questionnaires are sent home every year to identify next steps and evaluate children's participation and enjoyment in PE and sports.
